2. Please adhere to the following guidelines:

- a) Use 1-inch margins (2.5 cm) at the top, bottom and both sides.
- b) Single space all text and use 10-point type (Font style Times New Roman is preferred.)
- c) Align all text to the left side of the page.
- I) Type the title of the paper on the first line in all capital letters. (Do not abbreviate and please use a title indicative of the content of the abstract. To facilitate electronic retrieval, please include all words necessary to identify the subject matter.)
- e) Leave the second line blank.

- f) Type the first initial and last name of each author, the institution, city, state, and country where the work was performed.
- g) Leave the next line blank.
- h) Type the main body of the abstract. The total length should be no longer than 300 words.
- Conference registration form and payment must be submitted upon approval of abstract.
- All accepted abstracts submitted for the ISN

 Gene Therapy meeting will be included in Kidney International.
- Abstracts may not be withdrawn once submitted.
